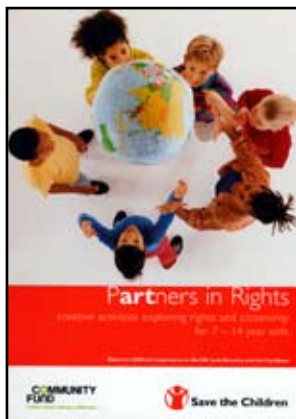

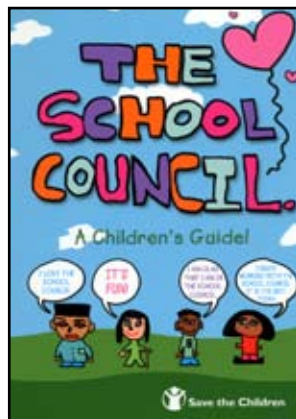

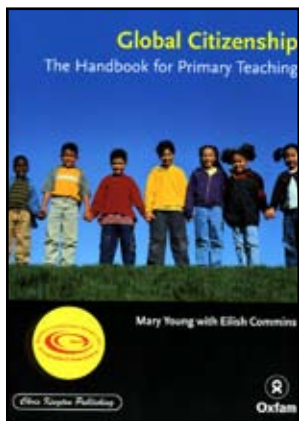
Partners in Rights: Creative activities exploring rights and citizenship. KS 2&3

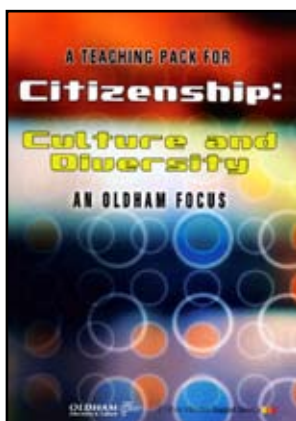
Global Citizenship: Handbook for primary teaching. KS 1&2

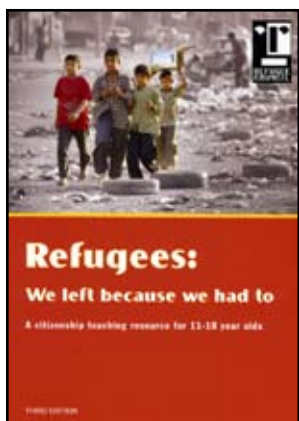
Escape to Safety interactive installation. Age 10+

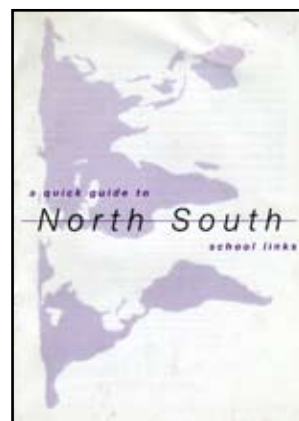
Refugees: We left because we had to. KS 3&4

 Leeds DEC, £3.25

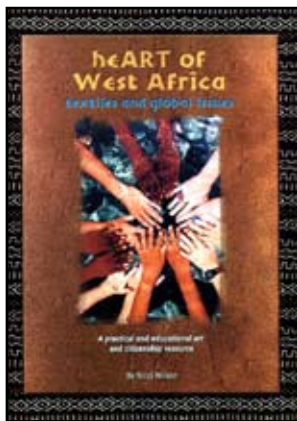

HeArt of West Africa: Textiles and global issues. All ages

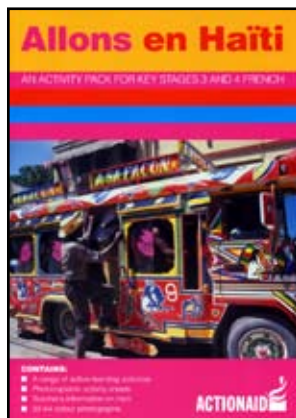
Global Education Derby, £12.99

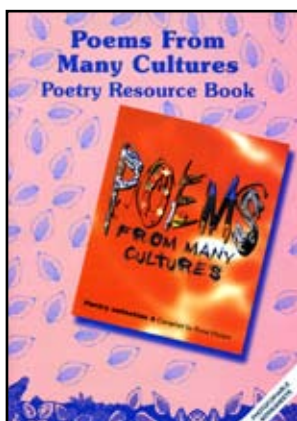
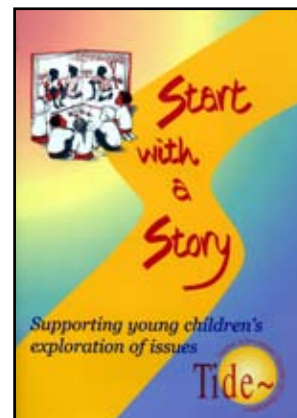

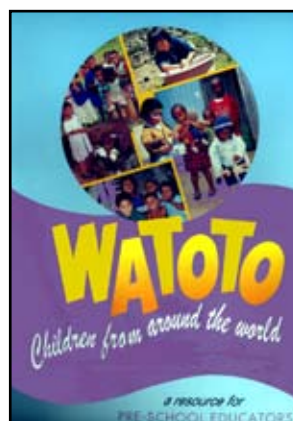
Poems from Many Cultures. KS 2&3

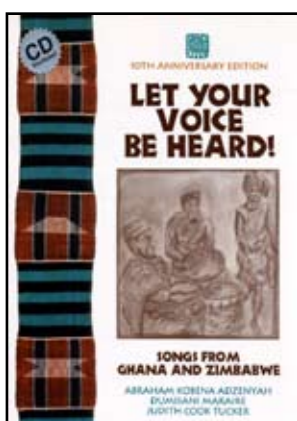
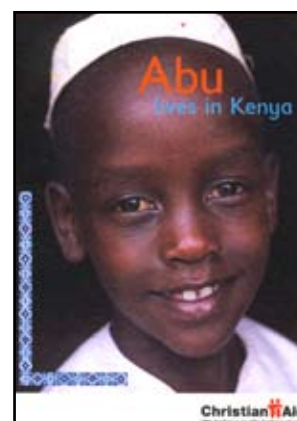

£3.30 small reader

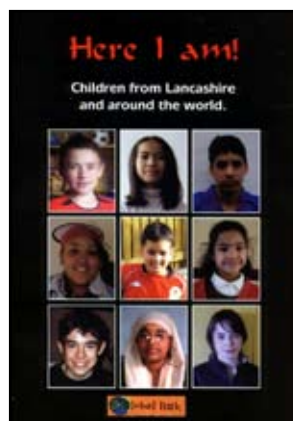

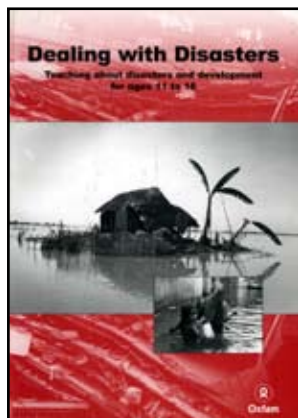


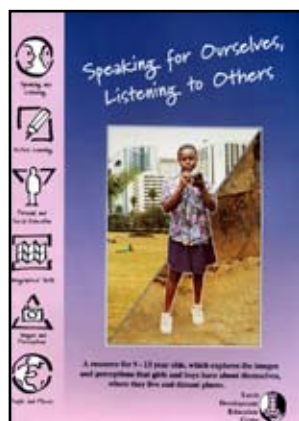
Photo Opportunities: Maths. KS 1&2

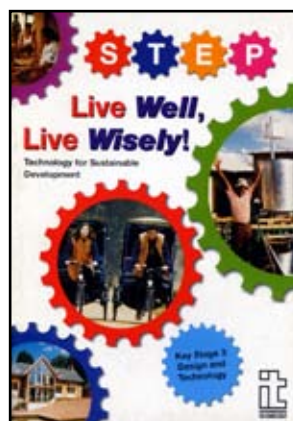

Practical Action, £10

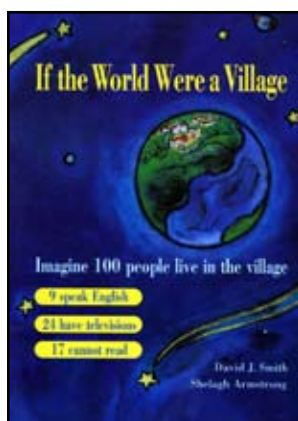

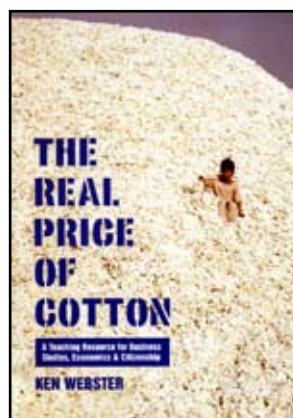
